Project Update: Greater Nanaimo Pollution Control Centre Outfall Replacement

The Greater Nanaimo Pollution Control Centre (GNPCC) treats wastewater from the City of Nanaimo, Snuneymuxw First Nation, and parts of the District of Lantzville. Treated effluent is discharged through a buried outfall that runs from the treatment plant to Morningside Park, and continues for approximately 2 km out into the Strait of Georgia along the sea floor. The outfall is being replaced so it can continue to protect the environment.

On June 24, 2016, the first of two sections of the marine outfall was successfully towed from Nanoose Bay, where it was assembled, and sunk in place. Weather depending, the second section will be towed and sunk into a trench in Hammond Bay tomorrow, June 28.

The contractor will be working tonight to maintain the trench that is required for pipe placement. These activities will require lighting for safety and will generate construction noise.
