
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Coastal Douglas Fir Biogeoclimatic Zone






The Heart of the Coastal Douglas Fir Zone

- All ecosystem variants now red listed
- Many rare species
- Most logged in the last century
- Primarily private land
- High degree of access
- At risk of disturbance

How are these Species and Ecosystems Protected?

- Province can protect:
 - nest sites of prescribed species (also birds and eggs)
 - fish habitat
 - riparian habitats through the RAR
- Federal government can protect:
 - Federally listed species on federal sites
 - fish habitat
- Local Governments can establish buffers (DPAs) to prevent degradation or loss of sites with ecological value
