

In a gravity-fed system (as opposed to a pressurized system), a distribution box cause a distribution should **evenly distribute** effluent from the septic tank to each pipe in the drainfield. **Even** distribution maximizes the life of your drainfield!

A well maintained distribution box is:

Level – to ensure equal flow distribution to each line in the drainfield

Watertight – in good repair with a water tight lid **Accessible** – to allow for regular inspection and maintenance **Equipped with speed levelers** – these small plastic caps help regulate flow to each line

Inspected regularly – to ensure that the box is level and effluent is being equally distributed.

If you think your distribution box needs repair or replacement, contact your Authorized Person.

GET TO KNOW YOUR SEPTIC SYSTEM

A BASIC SYSTEM IS MADE UP OF THESE MAIN COMPONENTS:

SEPTIC TANK – holds wastewater for a time to allow solids to settle to the bottom (sludge) and fats to float to the top (scum).

> The clear liquid in the middle (effluent) is sent to the drainfield. The tank separates liquids from the sludge or scum that might clog the drainfield, but by itself, doesn't provide a high level of treatment.

- **DISTRIBUTION BOX** distributes effluent evenly to the drainfield pipes. A tilted or damaged distribution box could lead to uneven loading of the pipes in the drainfield. Over time, this could cause your drainfield to fail, leading to costly repairs.
- **DRAINFIELD** Small holes in the pipes allow effluent to seep into the soil. In order for the drainfield to work effectively over the long term, each pipe must receive an equal flow of effluent.
- **SOIL** Naturally-occurring bacteria in the soil filter and treat the effluent. Most of the treatment "work" of a septic system happens in the soil. Grass draws moisture away, so the soil can continue to accept and treat effluent.



LOCATE YOUR SEPTIC SYSTEM

Mapping out and marking the location of your system's components will help you to protect your system and monitor its performance. These resources may help you locate your system:

1) Contact your local Island Health office to see if an as-built diagram of your system is on file.

AN AUTHORIZED PERSON WILL PERFORM MAINTENANCE OR REPAIRS ON YOUR SYSTEM

Under the provincial Sewerage System Regulation only an Authorized Person may install or repair a septic system. An Authorized Person is a Registered Onsite Wastewater Practitioner (ROWP) registered through the Applied Science Technologists & Technicians of BC (ASTTBC) or a Professional Engineer or Geoscientist registered through the Engineers and Geoscientists of BC (EGBC).

that the system is structurally sound, functioning, and that all mechanical and electrical parts are in good working order. Components can then be cleaned and repaired as necessary.

In 2018, the RDN is offering rebates in four categories to help you maintain your septic system.

- Up to \$200 for installing or replacing a Distribution Box *
- Up to \$300 for installing Risers *
- Pup to \$100 for installing an Effluent Filter *
- \$600 flat rate towards the replacement of a malfunctioning system (cannot be combined with Category 1, 2 or 3)*
- * The RDN will rebate 75% of eligible expenses to a maximum amount for categories 1-3. Flat rate for category 4.

Rebate funds are limited. Homeowners may request pre-approval and reserve funds for eligible maintenance for up to 90 days.

All work must be performed by an Authorized Person. Eligible work must be performed on existing systems between January 1 and December 14, 2018. *New construction is not eligible*.

- Distribution Box
 A properly functioning distribution box will maximize the effective lifespan of the drainfield by distributing effluent evenly to each line and preventing any one line from overload.
- Risers provide surface access to buried components. Risers make future pumping, inspection, and maintenance much easier. If you have risers, you have little to no digging to do hereafter.
- An Effluent Filter can prolong the life of your system by keeping solids out of the drainfield.
- Replace a Malfunctioning System
 Most septic systems last 25-30
 years. Eventually all systems need
 to be replaced.
