#### PURPOSE

To receive the report of the Public Hearing containing the summary of the minutes and submissions of the Public Hearing held on April 11, 2012, and further, to consider Bylaw No. 500.377, 2012, for third reading.

# BACKGROUND

Bylaw No. 500.377 was introduced and given 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> reading on March 27, 2012. This was followed by a Public Hearing held on April 11, 2012. The summary of the Public Hearing is attached for the Board's consideration (*see Attachment No. 2*).

The purpose of this zoning amendment bylaw is to rezone the subject property from Residential 1, Subdivision District 'K' (RS1K) to Residential 1, Subdivision District 'N' (RS1N) in order to reduce the minimum parcel size from 4000 m<sup>2</sup>, with or without community water or community sewer, to 1600 m<sup>2</sup>, with community water to facilitate a future nine-lot residential subdivision.

#### PROPOSED CHANGES TO CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

Prior to the Public Hearing, the following two concerns were raised:

A concern was raised over the potential impact of land clearing on trees located on the adjacent park. In response, the applicant obtained an Arbourist to conduct an assessment which identified four trees within the park that have physical defects that are a concern and should be removed and/or modified in order that they do not become hazard trees as a result of land clearing for the proposed lots.

In addition, although lots of the size proposed must be serviced by a community water system, a concern was raised that water wells could be drilled on the proposed lots at a later date which could affect the aquifer. In response the applicant has agreed to prohibit drilling wells on the subject property through a Section 219 covenant.

In response to the above concerns, staff recommend the Board support an amendment to the previously approved conditions (Schedule 1). This amendment would require a clause to be added to the Section 219 covenant registering the Hydrogeological Assessment Report that prohibits future well drilling on the subject property and would require that the recommendations of the Arbourist be secured prior to adoption. It should be noted that these items do not constitute new information as they were identified prior to the Public Hearing and were presented and made available at the Public Hearing.

# ALTERNATIVES

- 1. To receive the Report of the Public Hearing and give 3<sup>rd</sup> reading to "Regional District of Nanaimo Land Use and Subdivision Amendment Bylaw No. 500.377, 2012".
- 2. To receive the report of the Public Hearing and deny "Regional District of Nanaimo Land Use and Subdivision Amendment Bylaw No. 500.377, 2012".

# SUMMARY/CONCLUSIONS

The purpose of Bylaw No. 500.377, 2012 is to rezone the subject property to in order to permit a future nine-lot residential subdivision. The amendment bylaw was introduced and given 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> reading on March 27, 2012 and proceeded to Public Hearing on April 11, 2012. The requirements set out in the amended Conditions of Approval *(see Schedule 1)* are to be completed by the applicant prior to the Board's consideration of the bylaw for adoption. As the subject property is within 800 metres of a highway interchange, pursuant to the *Transportation Act*, the proposed amendment bylaw is subject to the approval of the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure. Therefore, staff recommend that Bylaw No. 500.377. 2012 be considered for 3<sup>rd</sup> reading.



#### To: Bill Veenhof

My name is Trent Bouchard. We met briefly at the Public Information Meeting NO. PL2011-178 2900 Leon Rd. Electoral 'H' at the Lighthouse Community Centre on February 16, 2012. I just found out that the Public Hearing on this issue (Regional District of Nanaimo Land Use and Subdivision Amendment Bylaw No. 500.377, 2012) is to be held on April 11, 2012. I am very upset that this hearing is to be held at a time when the developer, Jim Deas of Fern Road Consulting Ltd., knew I would be out of town. He also knew that my wife would be out of town that day. He knows this because he is a neighbour and I have spoken to him about this. I am taking a 3 month course to be a heavy equipment operator that finishes mid to late May. My wife will be attending a concert in Victoria with 12 of her friends. I bought her a ticket for Christmas that is how he knew to shoot for this date.

The current subdivision plan will have a major negative impact on my property and lifestyle and privacy. I need to be there to protect my interests. We are the people most affected by this proposed subdivision. I feel that we are being squeezed out. This developer bought the land directly across the street from us; he tried to buy the land on the other side of us and built illegal split level rental and other infractions of the current bylaws. He has now bought the acreage that is the subject of the subdivision. My wife and I have lived here in this house for 20 years. We do not object to development, we just want to protect our interests and make sure that what the developer is doing won't devalue our land and remove our privacy. The current plan calls for 3 or 4 lots right along the length of our property. I did submit an alternate division proposal, but heard nothing. There was also talk of absorption of the park land and monies put into another park. We don't want that to happen.

I feel as if I have to give up on my schooling and hire a lawyer. I have spoken to a realtor about how the loss of privacy would affect the value of our property. This realtor felt it could decrease the value by as much as \$75,000. I don't think this bylaw amendment should be allowed to be put through when the neighbors most affected are out of town. This seems sneaky and underhanded. If this bylaw amendment is pushed through in our absence, we will go public with this. We will not go quietly.

#### PURPOSE

To consider the Special Event busing request submitted by the Nanaimo Port Authority for cruise ships arriving in Nanaimo on May 5, 2012, September 15, 2012, September 26, 2012 and September 30, 2012.

# BACKGROUND

Correspondence dated March 30, 2012 (*Appendix 1*) was received from the Nanaimo Port Authority requesting the participation of the Regional District of Nanaimo (RDN) Transit for upcoming cruise ship arrivals on May 5, 2012, September 15, 2012, September 26, 2012 and September 30, 2012.

The Nanaimo Port Authority has requested that a shuttle bus service be established on the dates of cruise ship arrivals to provide service to the cruise ship passengers. It is anticipated there will be 2,000 passengers on board each vessel, with potentially three-quarters of the passengers disembarking the ship and using the shuttle service.

The Nanaimo Port Authority will be paying all costs associated with the shuttle bus service.

In 2011 the RDN partnered with the Nanaimo Port Authority to provide shuttle service on two days each in May and September. The shuttle service that transported 10,176 passengers was a huge success for both the RDN and Nanaimo Port Authority.

Staff has recommended to the Nanaimo Port Authority that five (5) Nova buses be used from 0830 to 1130 hours in order to transport the majority of passengers from the cruise ship terminal. After 1130 hours two (2) Nova buses would be removed from service, leaving three (3) Nova buses for the remainder of the day. A bus would leave the terminal every five minutes during the day for a total of 93 trips.

The RDN will have sufficient spare vehicles to accommodate the request for Saturday, May 5, 2012, Saturday, September 15, 2012 and Sunday, September 30, 2012. In order to maintain regular scheduled service, the RDN will not have sufficient spare vehicles to provide shuttle service on Wednesday, September 26, 2012.

This request meets the RDN policy on the use of buses for Special Events in that the event is within the transit service area and the event is community oriented; however, only cruise ship passengers would be able to use the service.

BC Transit has been advised of the request.

#### ALTERNATIVES

- 1. Approve the application from the Nanaimo Port Authority to provide shuttle bus service for cruise ships on May 5, 2012, September 15, 2012 and September 30, 2012.
- 2. Do not approve the application from the Nanaimo Port Authority to provide shuttle bus service and provide alternate direction to staff.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Staff has confirmed the Nanaimo Port Authority will pay all costs associated with providing shuttle bus service on May 5, 2012, September 15, 2012 and September 30, 2012. The estimated cost of the proposed service for all four days is \$16,000.

#### SUSTAINABILITY

Given the essential role of public transit in a sustainable region, all efforts of the Transportation Services Department are founded on generating positive implications for the sustainability of the region. In particular, providing residents a meaningful alternative to the private automobile, which in turn reduces greenhouse gas emissions and mitigates the effects of climate change, is one of the primary goals of the Transit Department.

#### CONCLUSIONS

The Nanaimo Port Authority has made an application under the Special Events Policy requesting that bus shuttle service be established in the downtown core, on the dates of cruise ship arrivals, to provide bus service for cruise ship passengers.

The RDN will have sufficient spare vehicles to accommodate the request for Saturday, May 5, 2012, Saturday, September 15, 2012 and Sunday, September 30, 2012. To maintain regular scheduled service, the RDN will not have sufficient spare vehicles to provide shuttle service on Wednesday, September 26, 2012.

Staff recommends the request on May 5, 2012, September 15, 2012 and September 30, 2012 since this provides a good opportunity to raise the profile of Nanaimo Transit, costs are covered by the Nanaimo Port Authority and adequate resources are available for the service.

#### RECOMMENDATION

That the application made by the Nanaimo Port Authority for the Regional District of Nanaimo to provide bus service for cruise ships arriving on Nanaimo on May 5, 2012, September 15, 2012 and September 30, 2012, at the cost of Nanaimo Port Authority, be approved.

After a very successful partnership with the Regional District of Nanaimo in 2011 for use of the RDN buses to provide shuttle bus service for cruise passengers, we hope to work with you again for a closed network system using buses to shuttle passenger into our community.

There will be four cruise ship visits to Nanaimo this season on May 5<sup>th</sup>, September 15<sup>th</sup>, September 26<sup>th</sup> and September 30<sup>th</sup>. Each vessel is expected to have 2,000 passengers on board and as in the past, at least three-quarters of the passengers make their way into the community for independent exploration. All of these vessels will be arriving in the morning at 0700 and departing at 1700 hours. The shore excursions typically start around 0830 with most gone by 1000 hours. It is expected that the majority of the self guided visitors will start coming off the ship at 0930 hours, and most will have left the ship by noon. The ships also have approximately 900 crew and they will likely start departing prior to noon and will return to the ship no later than 1530 hours.

The first vessel to arrive is the Norwegian Pearl with a departure time of 1700 hours and generally, all passengers are required to return to the ship at 1630 to allow for passenger head count and security.

It is our intention to utilize the same route as was used for the majority of the visits last year, which provides for a consistent cycle time and reduction of any potential waiting time for the cruise passengers queuing at the terminal to take a bus into the downtown area.

We look forward to working with the RDN again this year and await your confirmation that the buses can provide the cruise transportation services from our terminal through the downtown area.

#### PURPOSE

To present to the Board an amendment to Bylaw No. 1556 to include the District of Lantzville as a participant in the Drinking Water and Watershed Protection service.

#### BACKGROUND

The Drinking Water and Watershed Protection (DWWP) service was established after a successful referendum held in November of 2008. Initially, the service area for the new function included only properties within the electoral areas. Municipalities, while supportive of the initiative, declined to join the service at that time.

The Town of Qualicum Beach, City of Parksville and City of Nanaimo subsequently joined the Team WaterSmart portion of the program and provided support funding for this component. This partnership was valuable in shaping outreach activities and reaching a larger portion of the region's population.

In November 2011 in conjunction with an agreement to establish new Economic Development services, the municipalities of Nanaimo, Parksville and Qualicum Beach agreed to become full participants in the DWWP service. The costs of their participation will be phased in until all participating jurisdictions are raising funds at a rate of \$8.00 per property per year.

In December 2011 the former DWWP Advisory Committee was established as a technical committee reporting to the Sustainability Select Committee. The Sustainability Select Committee has a membership of five electoral area and five municipal directors.

The District of Lantzville recently advised that they now also wish to be a full participating member in the service, which would make the Drinking Water and Watershed Protection Service a fully supported regional service. The District of Lantzville would also phase in its participation in the same manner as the City of Nanaimo, initially contributing at a rate of \$3.00 per property in 2012.

The DWWP Technical Advisory Committee terms of reference will be adjusted to reflect the District of Lantzville's staff participation.

# **ALTERNATIVES**

1. Approve Bylaw No. 1556.02 to include the District of Lantzville in the Drinking Water Watershed Protection service.

2. Do not amend Bylaw No. 1556 at this time.

# FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

# <u>Alternative 1</u>

Under this alternative, the District of Lantzville would participate on the same funding schedule as the City of Nanaimo. Their contribution to the service in 2012 would be \$4608; the following table shows the rates to be applied through to 2017:

#### SUSTAINABILITY IMPLICATIONS

Inclusion of the District of Lantzville establishes the Drinking Water and Watershed Protection service as a full regional service. Watersheds, aquifers and surface water resources are natural systems that do not correspond to political boundaries; therefore, a regional approach to the protection of the water resource will benefit from full participation of and provide benefit to all electoral areas and municipalities in the regional district.

#### SUMMARY

The District of Lantzville has advised that they wish to join the Drinking Water and Watershed Protection service. The phased contribution model established for the inclusion of the Town of Qualicum Beach, City of Parksville and the City of Nanaimo has been used to determine the District of Lantzville's annual financial contribution to the service. The rate per property will increase by \$1.00 per year from \$3.00/year in 2012 to \$8.00/year in 2017.

The inclusion of the District of Lantzville will provide for full participation of all municipalities and electoral areas in a regional DWWP service.

#### RECOMMENDATION

That "Drinking Water and Watershed Protection Service Amendment Bylaw No. 1556.02, 2012" be introduced for three readings and be forwarded to the Inspector of Municipalities for approval.

# A BYLAW TO AMEND THE DRINKING WATER AND WATERSHED PROTECTION SERVICE ESTABLISHING BYLAW NO. 1556

WHEREAS the Regional District of Nanaimo wishes to amend Regional District of Nanaimo Drinking Water and Watershed Protection Service Establishing Bylaw No. 1556, 2008 to add the District of Lantzville as a participating area;

AND WHEREAS the Regional Board has obtained the consent of at least two-thirds of the participants as required under section 802(1)(b) of the *Local Government Act*.

NOW THEREFORE the Board of the Regional District of Nanaimo in open meeting assembled enacts as follows:

- 1. Drinking Water and Watershed Protection Service Establishing Bylaw No. 1556, 2008 is amended as follows:
  - 1. Sections 2 and 3 are amended by deleting the word "and" after the words "City of Parksville" and adding the words " and the District of Lantzville" after the words "Town of Qualicum Beach".
  - 2. Section 4(e) is deleted and the following is substituted therefore:
    - (e) The amounts to be levied to the City of Nanaimo, the City of Parksville, the Town of Qualicum Beach and the District of Lantzville shall be requisitioned in accordance with section 4(a) (property tax).
  - 3. Section 6(a) is deleted and the following is substituted therefore:
    - (a) the amount apportioned to the City of Nanaimo and the District of Lantzville shall be equal each year to the amount resulting from multiplying the rate shown in each year of the table below times the number of taxable properties in the City of Nanaimo and the District of Lantzville, as certified by the City of Nanaimo and the District of Lantzville and provided to the Regional District of Nanaimo:

This bylaw may be cited for all purposes as the "Drinking Water and Watershed Protection Service Amendment Bylaw No. 1556.02, 2012".
