#### **PURPOSE**

The Regional Hospital District Select Committee is a committee of the Nanaimo Regional Hospital District (NRHD) Board which provides advice and recommendations to the NRHD Board regarding requests for capital funding from the Vancouver Island Health Authority.

#### **ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

The Regional Hospital District Select Committee mandate is to provide political oversight for health capital related initiatives. The Committee is the forum to which staff report on Regional Hospital District initiatives.

The Committee's responsibilities are:

- 1. Consider staff reports on the Regional Hospital District budget and requests for capital funding from the Vancouver Island Health Authority and make recommendations to the NRHD Board including:
  - The level of taxation for the next year and the components of grant funding in the budget
  - Whether to support capital projects to secure Provincial cost sharing
  - · Recommending the amount and use of annual capital grants
- 2. At its discretion, hear and consider public delegations on matters within the scope of its purview and, where appropriate, make recommendations to the NRHD Board arising out of such delegations.
- 3. Pursue matters referred to the Committee by the NRHD Board and report back to the Board expeditiously, as required.

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

- The Committee is comprised of six Directors with one Electoral Area Director from District 68, one Electoral Area Director from District 69, one Director from the Town of Qualicum Beach, one Director from the City of Parksville, one Director from the City of Nanaimo and one Director from either the City of Nanaimo or the District of Lantzville.
- The members of the Committee and the Committee Chairperson will be appointed annually by the NRHD Board Chairperson.

#### **MEETINGS**

- The Committee will meet at intervals it determines to be appropriate, in consultation with the Director of Finance, but will structure its activities to meet approximately three times per year.
- The Director of Finance will be responsible for assigning staff to support the Committee including the coordination of agendas, minutes and staff contacts for Committee members.

#### **SUMMARY:**

On February 9, 2017, Island Health provided its request for the 2017/2018 minor capital projects and capital equipment at Nanaimo Regional Hospital District (NRHD) designated facilities and is requesting that cost sharing be approved in the amount of \$3,444,055. This request is unchanged from the 2017 provisional Hospital District budget.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

On February 9, 2017, Island Health detailed their requests for minor capital projects and capital equipment funding for the 2017/18 year (Attachment 1) in the amount of \$3,444,055, which is unchanged from 2016.

The minor capital projects list provided totals \$4,346,178 with the NRHD's 40% cost share of \$1,650,071. Five projects will continue into 2018/19 and require a commitment from the NRHD to provide the continued funding over those years.

The second list details planned capital equipment purchases totaling \$4,484,961 with \$1,793,984 as the NRHD's 40% cost share.

#### **ALTERNATIVES:**

- 1. Approve the requests as presented.
- 2. Provide alternative direction.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The cost sharing of minor capital projects and equipment by the NRHD is included annually as part of the budget for the Hospital District and is incorporated in the 2017 plan being reported on separately. Island Health has submitted the requested cost sharing at the funding level amount of \$3,444,055 which is based on the provisional budget approved by the Nanaimo Regional Hospital District Board in November. There are no unanticipated financial implications as a result of this request.

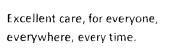

#### Re: 2017/18 Capital Projects and Equipment

I am writing to advise you of the Island Health 2017/18 capital plan for which NRHD cost-sharing is requested.

I understand the NRHD has approved a provisional 2017 budget of \$3,444,055 for minor capital projects and equipment. Island Health proposes the following allocation which we have itemized in the attached project and equipment lists:

Minor Capital Projects	\$1,650,071
Equipment	1,793,984
Total:	\$3,444,055

#### **Patient Portal Project**

In recent semi-annual meetings between Island Health and RHD representatives, the importance of Information Management/Information Technology (IM/IT) in health care was discussed. Island Health described how RHD cost-sharing on high priority IM/IT capital projects will improve outcomes for Island Health residents. This includes "smart" or integrated IM/IT equipment and IM/IT infrastructure to enable increased functionality in equipment; this would not include administrative IM/IT capital projects. The intent is not to increase the financial burden on RHDs, but rather to ensure the highest priority capital projects are funded whether they are traditional facility, equipment or IM/IT projects.

For 2017/18, Island Health is requesting RHD cost-sharing for the Patient Portal. This is an Electronic Health Record (EHR) tool that will provide convenient and secure web-based access for residents to their health records. Through the portal, residents can review information Island Health has on file for them, view their prior lab and diagnostic test results, view their health record reports, see their schedule of past and planned visits, access educational materials and in some cases directly interact with their care team via secure messaging. The tool is designed to encourage individuals to participate in their health care and support a move towards self-management.

The Province has identified improved access to health records as a high priority and the portal helps facilitate this by providing convenient access to information and services for residents living within Island Health. The portal is planned to be deployed in a phased manner starting in 2017/18 within specific geographies and patient populations and eventually to cover all of Island Health.

Beyond the functionality mentioned, subsequent phases of patient portal may include:

- Online scheduling system for primary and ambulatory care the ability to request and/or self-schedule your appointments. This should reduce wait times by streamlining capacity management practices, essentially optimizing the flow of patients through our facilities.
- Enhanced communication with the care team. This should reduce the wait times if you do not have
  to attend the hospital for your care information needs (e.g. medication refills and quick
  consultations).
- Patient documentation ability for patients to complete history/physical assessments and presurgical assessments online and have these become part of their electronic health record.
- Wellness management ability for patients to link fitbit/diet tracking applications to their portal based personal health record.

The total project cost for the Patient Portal is \$600,000. Island Health is proposing this cost be divided by RHD based on the 2015 population statistics provided by BC Stats. The allocation for NRHD is \$120,941, or 20 percent of the total, and is included on the minor capital projects list.

#### Other Updates

As noted in previous correspondence, Island Health is proceeding with planning related to replacement of the Nanaimo Regional General Hospital (NRGH) Intensive Care Unit and Boiler Plant projects. In addition, Island Health is also planning a new MRI at NRGH. This MRI project has an estimated cost of \$4.5 million (equipment and associated construction). Further information on these major projects will be provided after the schematic design stage.

I would like to thank the NRHD for its significant contribution to Island Health's capital projects and equipment. We are grateful for your support, and we appreciate partnering with you to meet the Nanaimo Regional District's health infrastructure needs.

Nanaimo Regional Hospital District 2017 Revised Budget

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

1. That "Nanaimo Regional Hospital District 2017 Annual Budget Bylaw No. 163, 2017" be introduced and read three times.

That "Nanaimo Regional Hospital District 2017 Annual Budget Bylaw No. 163, 2017" be adopted.

#### SUMMARY:

Regional Hospital Districts are required to approve an annual budget on or before March 31 each year.

Attachment 1 shows a revised budget which raises \$7,193,715 in property tax revenues for 2017 (3.0% increase over 2016). The budget includes \$3.44 million for capital equipment and minor capital projects at facilities in the Nanaimo Regional Hospital District (NRHD) area; \$2.75 million for debt payments in 2017 and a \$1.8 million transfer to reserve for future infrastructure projects.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

At the December 6, 2016 NRHD Board Meeting the following motion for the 2017 Hospital District Budget was approved:

That the 2017 Regional Hospital District Provisional Budget be approved with the following components:

Property tax requisition \$ 7,158,794

Capital grant allowance \$ 3,444,055

CARRIED

Since that time, a formal annual capital grant funding request has been received from Island Health and incorporated into the attached revised 2017 budget and 2017 - 2021 projections document (Attachment 1).

Compared to the provisional budget, the revised budget shows an increase of \$35,000 (0.5% increase) in property taxes due to additional debt servicing costs now included for the potential purchase of a new MRI at the Nanaimo Regional General Hospital (estimated project cost \$4.5 million, NRHD share \$1.8 million).

Presently, major capital projects included in the budget which include borrowing are as follows:

Project	NRHD Share	Timing
Electrical Energy Plant Upgrade	\$4,676,800	Currently underway

Boiler Plant Upgrade	\$5,000,000 preliminary estimate for gas boiler	2017-2019

At this time there are no other major projects proposed by Island Health; however, their long-term plan does include a new patient tower at the Nanaimo Regional General Hospital when funding becomes available. The 2017 revised budget includes a \$1.8 million transfer to a reserve fund established for significant projects such as the new patient tower and an annual funding envelope of \$3,444,055 for smaller capital equipment and projects (up to \$1.5 million) at designated facilities in the NRHD.

#### **ALTERNATIVES:**

- 1. Introduce and approve Bylaw No. 163 as presented for the 2017 Nanaimo Regional Hospital District Budget.
- 2. Make further changes to the annual budget and approve an amended bylaw.

#### **FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:**

#### Alternative 1

#### 2017 Revised Budget

The revised budget includes a 3.0% increase to the 2017 requisition as compared to 2016 which was a 2% increase. This will result in a tax requisition of \$7,193,715 for 2017 (2016 requisition= \$6,984,190). The estimated tax cost for 2017 is \$19.91 per \$100,000 based on 2017 assessments which is below the 2016 rate of \$21.80 as a result of increased assessment values throughout the region.

Preliminary results for 2016 indicate a surplus of approximately \$630,000 greater than planned largely due to timing of the Electrical Plant Upgrade project billings from Island Health as \$411,000 has been reserved from annual grants for this project which will carry forward to 2017. Ongoing lower interim financing rates and better than expected interest revenue contributed approximately \$100,000 to the surplus. As well \$100,000 was received from MFA as a refund of surplus sinking funds on extinguished debt.

The 2017 transfer to reserves for future major projects is increased to \$1.8 million (provisional budget - \$1.7 million) as a result of \$100,000 received from MFA in 2016 as noted above. The annual capital grant allowance is \$3,444,055, which has been held static for several years as Island Health has not required the full funding envelope in the last couple of years and a portion of the funds has been used for major capital instead. For 2017, they have provided a list of items with matched funding to fully utilize the allowance.

#### 2017 to 2021 Budget Forecast

The outlook for future years in Attachment 1 has been revised based on updated information. The proposed increases to the tax requisition for 2018 to 2021 are estimated at 3% in order to maintain reserve fund transfers. Debt servicing costs are estimated to increase from \$2.8 million in 2017 to \$3.7 million in 2021. These amounts will continue to be revised as information is received from Island Health on capital project plans. Should there be approval from the Province for a new major capital project that the NRHD approves for cost sharing, debt servicing costs would need to be revised for the future.

#### Alternative 2

A final budget must be approved by March 31 so any alternative direction would have to observe this deadline.

- Cheques with a value of more than \$250,000 have no preprinted signatures and must be signed
  individually by two signing officers, typically the Director of Finance and the Manager, Accounting
  Services.

- 1. Approve the signing authorities as presented to be applicable to the Nanaimo Regional Hospital District.
- 2. Recommend an alternative list of signing authorities.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:
